FAITH IN FOCUS: WHAT AM I BID? In some countries auctioneers set the price at a high level and then come down in stages until someone is prepared to put in a bid. The first person to bid gets the object at the price they were willing to jump in at. The amusing story today from Genesis sees Abraham holding an auction with God and pestering God to keep lowering the price. God is angry and threatens to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah, but Abraham plays on God's sense of mercy and compassion and manages to get a bargain outcome for the towns. Abraham knows that it is not God's nature wantonly to destroy what he has created. A chance for a fresh start is much more God's style.

Jesus gives us a similar impression of God when he talks about the need for praying without ceasing. He compares praying to God with a pestering neighbour who never gives up so that in the end you give in to him and let him have what he wants. Does this mean that God is soft? That God is a bit of a pushover? That we can twist God round our little fingers? More importantly does it mean that sin doesn't matter? Can we do what we like and then just ask God for pardon and expect to receive it? Can we expect that God will give us everything we ask for? A win on the lottery, a baby, a cure from terminal illness?

Jesus encourages us to pray and to be confident that whatever we need we will receive. Ask, seek, knock. Yet he is clear about the person who is listening to our prayers: a Father who knows each one of his children and knows exactly what they need. God does not promise us what we want but what we need.

Perhaps the secret of prayer is never to give up asking God to let us know what we need rather than bombarding him with endless wish lists. What we want may not be what God wants, because God knows what's not good for us. But if we ask God for what we need then we will never be disappointed. (Author unknown.)

WORLD YOUTH DAY: 25th-31st July The theme of the XXXI World Youth Day in Krakow is: 'Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy' (Mt 5:7). Our Holy Father Francis has chosen the fifth of the eight Beatitudes, given by Jesus in his Sermon on the Mount on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, to show the importance of the Beatitudes which are at the heart of Jesus' teaching. In his first Sermon, Jesus presents us with eight examples of qualities that bring us closer to the Kingdom of God.

PRAYER FOR PEACE The annual remembrance of the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings at Aylesford Priory is **Tuesday 9th August** starting at 8.20pm. All are welcome to join in prayer that, in future, the world's nations may find less violent ways to resolve conflicts. As Pope Francis indicated when speaking at the United Nations, "An ethics and a law based on the threat of mutual destruction – and possibly the destruction of all mankind – are self-contradictory... There is urgent need to work for a world free of nuclear weapons, in full application of the non-proliferation Treaty, in light and spirit, with the goal of a complete prohibition of these weapons." *Phil Kerton, Kent Diocesan Area J & P Group*.
