FAITH IN FOCUS: CHRISTMAS SPIRIT You've done it! The hysteria is over and you have arrived at Christmas Day without too much physical or psychological harm. It's all too easy at this point to collapse in a heap with the Radio Times and an overly large sherry feeling that Christmas is safely over for another year. But Christmas is more than just the culmination of Advent; it's the beginning of the Christmas Season, in which we are invited to contemplate on salvation "made flesh". As children, we visited church on Christmas day to sing Christmas carols and peep in at the cosy crib scene. As adults, we are invited to contemplate the deeper and long lasting meaning of Christmas.



How many times have we been guilty of thinking of God as a distant figure? How often have we wandered how to develop a relationship with a God who is supposed to love us, yet remains stubbornly silent and invisible. But on this day over twenty centuries ago, there was something of a miracle. God was no longer somebody we couldn't see or hear, God became "flesh" in the form a small child in a stable. God came into the world that he had created to save us. Jesus is the face and voice of God. Jesus became the blueprint of how we should live our lives. His life and work is there for us all to read and remember. He has left the Holy Spirit as his legacy to help and guide us. Our acceptance of Jesus is key to our relationship with God.

For children, the excitement of Christmas comes once a year. As adults, we learn to live the true meaning of Christmas not on this one day but every day. As Ebenezer Scrooge promises in the in final pages of Dickens' 'Christmas Carol' as he leaps out of bed on Christmas morning, the time before him his own to make amends in, "I will live in the past, the present and the future. St PETER'S CHURCH TREES When the church was built 30 years ago, a very nice screen of trees was planted round the perimeter to give some character to the bare site. However, 30 years on, the scene has changed dramatically: you can no longer even see the church through the forest which has grown up around it, and many of the trees themselves are either stunted in their growth, or growing so vigorously that they are damaging the roadways (see particularly the one at the top left corner which has heaved up the concrete). We need to take remedial action before further damage occurs, and have engaged tree surgeons who will be working on **Wednesday 11th** and **Thursday 12th January** to thin down and, in some cases, remove the excess of trees, leaving the good trees (such as the oaks) freedom to grow correctly. Please avoid parking in the church grounds on these days and take care to follow the warning signs.
